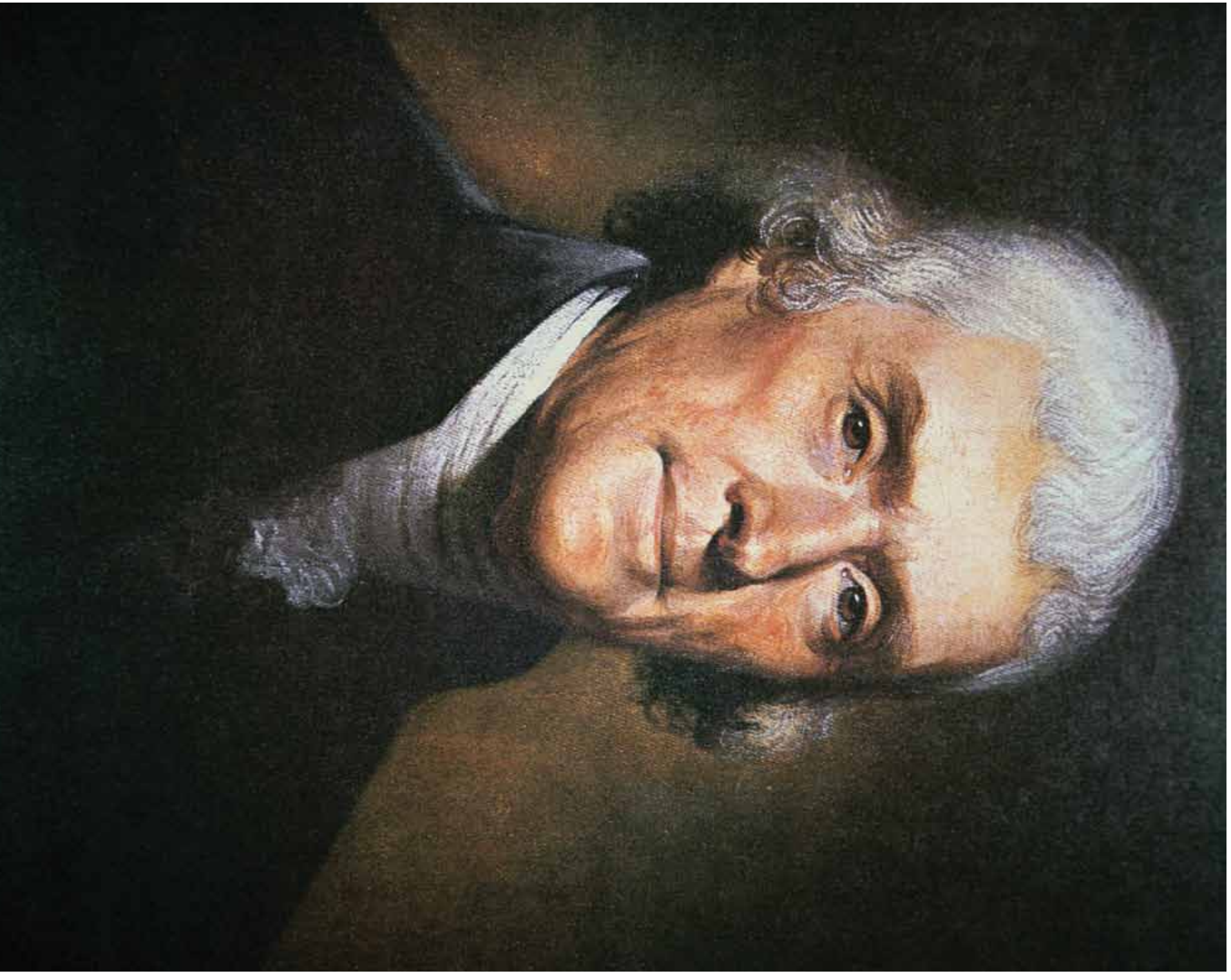

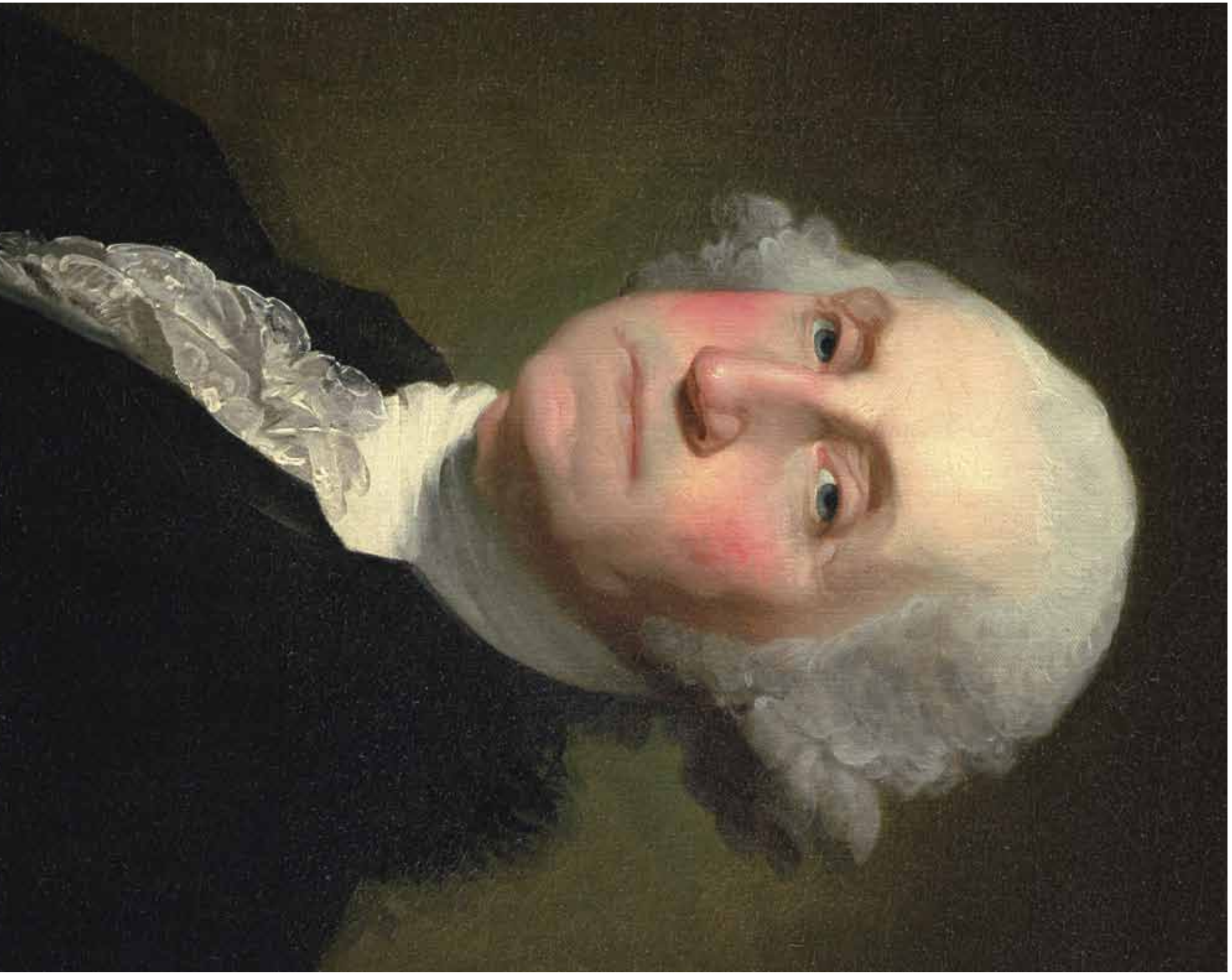

# We the People

of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do hereby ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

## Article I

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

## Article II

Section 1. The executive Power shall be vested in a President of the United States of America. He shall hold his Office for a Term of Years, which shall not exceed four Years; and he shall be eligible for one Term only, but he may be re-elected.

## Article III

Section 1. The judicial Power shall be vested in one Supreme Court, and in such inferior Courts as the Congress may from time to time ordain and establish. The Judges, both of the Supreme and inferior Courts, shall hold their Offices during good Behaviour, and shall, at any Time during their Continuance in Office, receive a Compensation, which shall not be diminished.

## Article IV

Section 1. No State shall be deprived of its equal Footing with the other States; nor shall any State be treated as an Outlier.

## Article V

Section 1. The Congress, whenever two thirds of both Houses shall so require, shall propose Amendments to this Constitution, or on the Application of the Legislatures of two thirds of the States, shall call a Convention for that Purpose, and any Amendment thus made shall be valid, as to all Intents and Purposes, as soon as ratified by three fourths of all the States which may then exist.

## Article VI

Section 1. This Constitution, and the Laws of the United States which shall be made in Pursuance thereof; and all Treaties made, or which shall be made, under the Authority of the United States, shall be the supreme Law of the Land; and the Judges in every State shall be bound thereby, any Thing in the Constitution or Laws of any State to the Contrary notwithstanding.

## Article VII

Section 1. The Ratification of seven States shall be sufficient for the Establishment of this Constitution between the States so ratifying the same.

## Done

in Convention by the unanimous Consent of the States present, the following Declaration, Resolutions, and Articles of Confederation and Amalgamation were adopted, to wit: That the United States, in Congress assembled, do hereby declare, that the thirteen united Colonies are free, sovereign and independent States, that they are absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown, and that all former Treaties, Connections and Alliances with that King, are hereby disavowed and rejected.

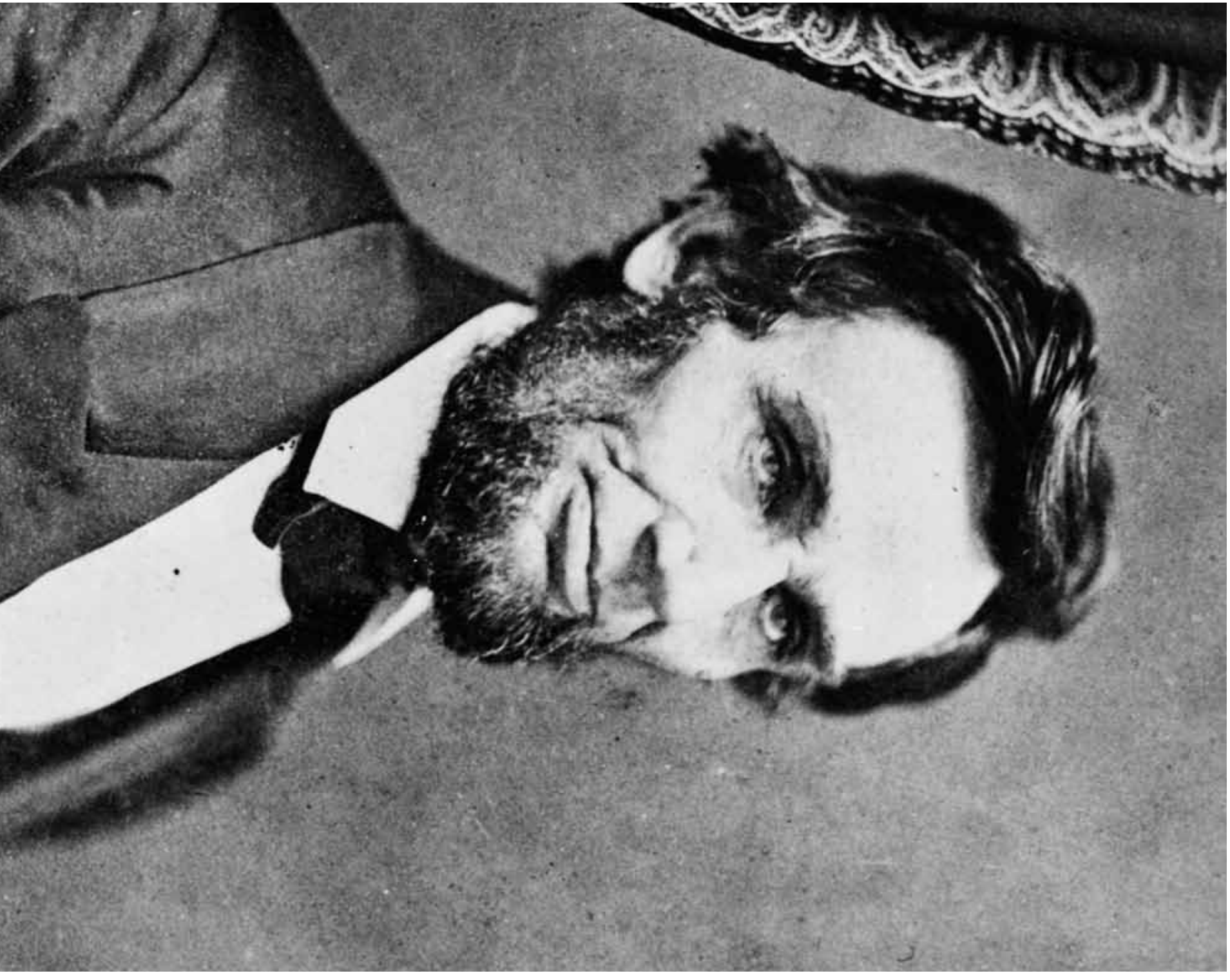

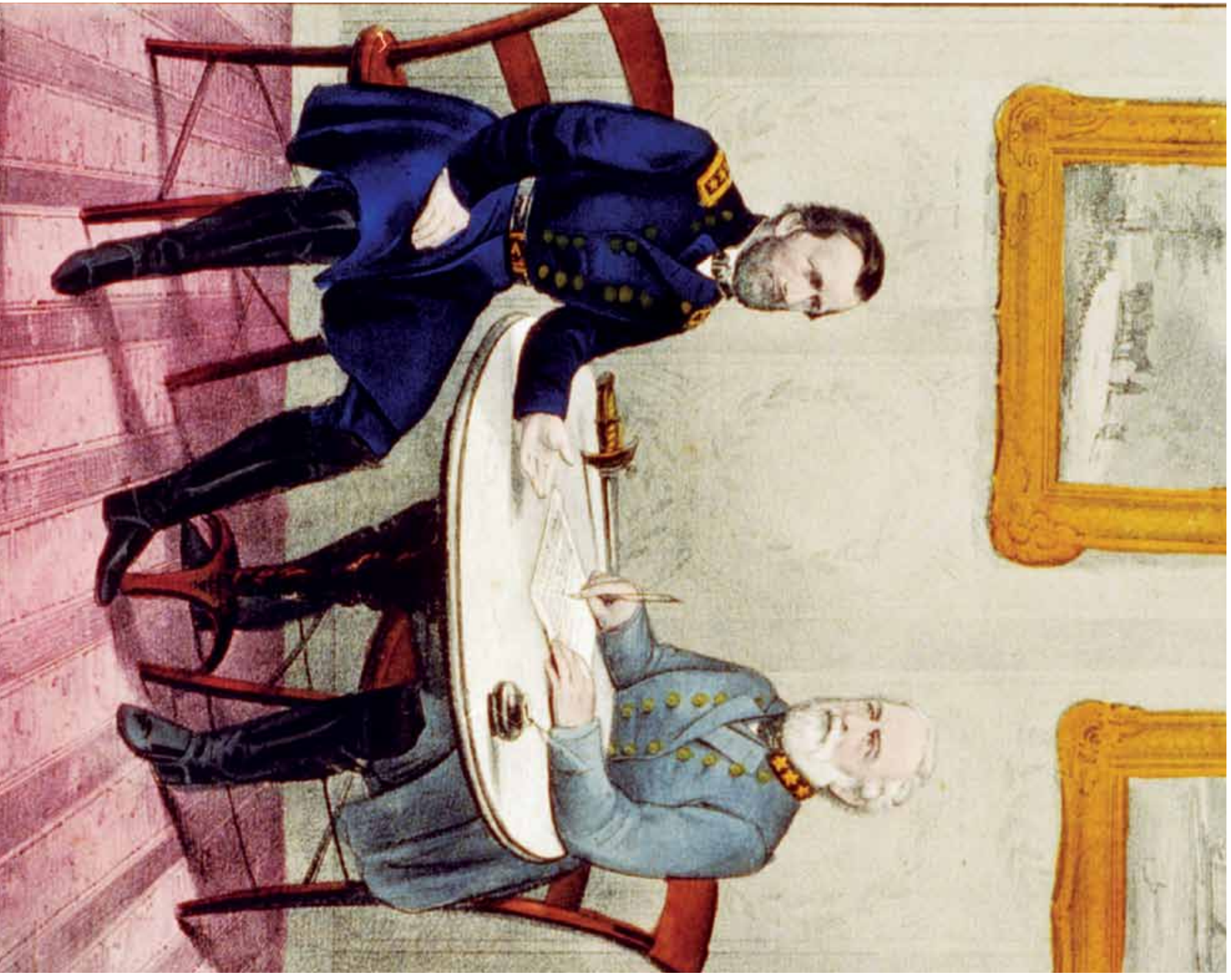
*The Battle of New Orleans was a victory for the United States.*
